SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Motion you've heard to withdraw AM0501, AM0502, and AM0503. They are withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: On with discussion of advancement to E & R Initial. Anybody wishing to speak to the bill, itself? Seeing no lights on, Senator Maxwell, did you wish to...?

SENATOR MAXWELL: Mr. President, I'll just urge everyone to advance LB 234. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing on advancement. The question before the body is advancement of LB 234 to E & R Initial. All in favor of the motion vote aye, and opposed nay. We're voting on advancement of LB 234. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 234.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 234 does advance. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

CLERK: LB 56 is a bill by Senator Byars. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9, referred to the Health and Human Services Committee for public hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments...I do have committee amendments, excuse me, Mr. President. (AM0157, Legislative Journal page 448.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Byars, you're recognized to open on LB 56.
