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ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: They are adopted. On with discussion of the bill, itself, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schimek, let me ask you just one question, quickly.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Certainly.

SENATOR BEUTLER: This is a great bill. I'm glad we're moving to protect these people, but I have to say on the other hand, that it annoys me enormously that we can't just stop these people from harassing these victims. But then we have to admit that we can't stop them from harassing victims and go further and pay more money to help protect them from the same people who won't stop. There is no fee associated with getting this protection, is there?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, there is not.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Would you...how would you react to the idea of adding a dollar or two to all stalking convictions, abuse convictions, and more narrowly charging the cost of this against people who have a tendency to be doing these sorts of things?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I wouldn't, personally, have a problem with that, Senator Beutler. I don't know exactly what kind of money that would bring in, but if you would like to explore that, I think actually that's a pretty good idea.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That it seems like a reasonable approach perhaps, I think I will explore it.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That somehow we should put back on these
