done. So I hope that you can support advancement of the bill. And with that, thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. You've heard the closing on the committee amendments. We'll proceed to vote on the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Back to the discussion on the bill. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I really appreciate what Senator Landis said, and I agree with every word that he uttered, and some that he did not utter. When it is necessary to target a specific operation or industry in this fashion by legislation, it is clear that we're not dealing with a good citizen, not dealing with a good neighbor. And I believe it was 1995 or thereabouts when I brought the underlying bill to try to give some protection to people who were brought here and dumped and not given any way to get back home. There were fibs told to them about the conditions under which they would live and work, and what kind of assistance would be available. And I was hoping that if we reached this new century, that legislation which I had gotten put on the books would no longer be necessary, it would be a dead letter, and I could be the one to make the motion or offer a bill that would repeal it. But instead of being able to repeal it, we are recognizing that the condition not only persists, but, as one of those aspirin commercials said, has grown increasingly severe. A point is going to have to be reached at some time where we really rein in these rogues, these types of operations. But since we all are practical politicians and must deal with the reality as we find it, I'm going to support this bill. And I'm glad that the provisions that we've added today will be accepted and enacted into law. Thank you, Mr. President.
