accurate term "certificate of veterinary inspection", and updates references to federal regulations governing interstate movement of animals. The bill can be broken down to include several things. The first is the definition of "animal". It...the bill amends the definition of animals whose importation is subject to the regulation under the Animal Import Act to include amphibians, but expands the definition to include embryos and semens for animals subject to the act. Now, the committee amendment actually removes the embryo and semen from this. And I'll explain that in the committee amendments. But the bill originally has that included. And it has a substitution of the term, in LB 160, substitutes the term "health certificate" for the term "certificate of veterinary inspection", which is more widely used term and is consistent with the term used in federal regulations. The bill amends 54-788 to update exceptions to the importation of animals without a certificate of veterinary inspection. The current law exempts animals that are moved directly to the federally inspected slaughter establishment. Number two, exempts cattle and swine moved directly to an approved auction market. And number three, it excludes poultry under eight weeks of age certified pollorum and typhoid clean prior to movement pursuant to the National Poultry Improvement Plan. It also adds three new categories to the term "animal", and that is horses, sheep, and goats, that may be moved to an approved auction market. It also exempts animals taken directly to a federally recognized slaughter establishment, rather than a federally inspected establishment. The term more accurately includes all types of slaughter facilities, such as a rendering facility, approved by government federal regulations as designations of animals moved without certificate of veterinary inspection. It adds exemptions to animals moved directly to a veterinary clinic for examination. I move the adoption of LB 160.
