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situation that endangers their own existence. So these various agencies that I mentioned, the Nebraska Humane Society, the Capital Humane Society, which is Lincoln, the National Animal Control Association, which is an umbrella organization, I presume, have asked that this legislation, this language that I'm including in the legislation, be put there. So I ask that you adopt the committee amendment, which becomes the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments by the Agriculture Committee by Chairman Kremer and Senator Chambers. Open for discussion. Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Thank you, Mr. President. I just wanted to rise in agreement with Senator Chambers, having worked in law enforcement for 12 years. We're starting to see a lot of new trends with the abuse of animals that a lot of people aren't familiar with. One of the newer trends is training Pit Bulls as drug dogs. You'll hide drugs under your house or, you know, your dog kennel, and then we've actually had to have the Humane Society come out to take charge of that. It's becoming very rampant. The pack dog I can attest for. We get calls all the time of rabid dogs in neighborhoods. And I just...I agree with Senator Chambers on every aspect of the treatment of the animals and what we need to do as far as that care and the mistreatment that goes on.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Mossey. Any further discussion on the committee amendments offered by the Ag Committee to the LB 274? Seeing none, Senator Kremer, did you wish to close?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes. I just wanted to thank Senator Chambers for bringing this bill. And he has explained it very well. And I think it's something that needs to be done. And I just urge you to adopt the committee amendments to LB 274.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. You've heard the closing on the committee amendments. The question before the body is adoption of those amendments to LB 274. All in favor of the motion vote aye, and opposed nay. We're voting on the
