advance. I urge you to advance. Again, the constitution stands. The federal law cannot be changed here. I urge you to run for Congress if you want to change that. But I think this is the best that we can do here in Nebraska. The Abood case clearly, clearly says that you could actually charge someone for the contract negotiations, you could charge them for contract administration, you could actually charge them for grievance adjustments. LB 226 doesn't do that. It doesn't charge anyone for a grievance that they don't ask for. They have to choose whether they want it or not. So they have to be in full agreement that they want to move forward with that grievance or that legal action. I ask for the advancement. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. You've heard the closing on advancement of LB 226. The motion before the body is the advancement of that bill. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 226 to E & R Initial. We're voting on the advancement of LB 226. Have you all voted who care to? Senator Redfield, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Could I have a roll call, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: A roll call...what did you request?

SENATOR REDFIELD: A call of the house and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Schrock, would you check in, please? Senator Mines, would you check in, please, and Senator Foley? Thank you. All members present or accounted for, there has been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, call the roll on the motion to advance LB 226.
