anything else. It's just an information item that would be out there and could be very useful in certain circumstances. Certainly, if the historical constitutional amendments pass, you have to have a baseline in order to calculate what the improvements are, so it would give them a baseline. So with that, I will ask your consideration to advance the bill. It's not a big issue. I think it's just an information issue. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Louden, followed by Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I can relate to Senator Kruse's situation, where we've had to put in for these tax exemptions for property. And it's been awhile since I've done that, but if I remember rightly, we usually had to describe the property. We usually had to give some dimensions or something of that sort, and where it was situated, and legal descriptions. So if there was any need for any type of valuation, I'm sure the county assessor could probably nearly do that right from their office. I'm sure it's some kind of information, but I really don't know as there's any information that we actually need. There's...when you ask for an insurance claim or something like that, if you don't send that in as a verification, why, you can write down about whatever number you so desire. In some areas, I'm sure you could put the valuation lower than perhaps it was actually worth. It would make the county committee feel a little bit better when they gave you the exemption. So I think right now this is probably something that really doesn't need to be done. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Hartnett, on the motion to advance.
