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time and every succeeding time. Judge, avenge me of mine adversary. And not because he feared God, not because he regarded man, but to save himself from this ongoing, persistent requesting by this woman, he acceded to her request and avenged her of her adversary. When I bring my rider, I know that the Legislature as a whole may be very unsympathetic. Some in the Legislature may be even hostile to what I'm trying to do, which is to prohibit discrimination in employment based on sexual orientation. But do you think that, being a man with ego, a man with a profound sense of self-respect and self-confidence, I will let it be said that I was outdone by a poor old widow woman who had nobody in the world to turn to but nevertheless was willing to face up to and ultimately face down an unjust judge feared by everybody in the land? No, I will not let that be said. That poor old widow woman is my example. She is my inspiration. And if men were not so chauvinistic, we could learn many things from women, and we would be the better for it, just as this society would be the better for it if it would learn to cease discriminating against people. I think a Nebraska policy which exists now in statute is the right one, and a good one. That policy declares it is this state's policy to ensure that every person who is employable be given the opportunity to procure employment without unjust discrimination. And when you are going to discriminate against somebody in the area of employment because of their sexual orientation or what you perceive to be their sexual orientation or because of what you were told is their sexual orientation, that is wrong, and it needs to be eradicated. And while I'm in this...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Legislature, that is what I intend to do. Now, many people in this body profess to be Christians. For you all's information, Jesus did not achieve everything he set out to do. He came to seek and to save those who were lost. And there probably, per capita, are more lost individuals on the floor of this Legislature than any other gathering anywhere in the world, including the penitentiary, because they've got a lot of Christians in prison. And based on the attitudes of some of them, that's where they belong. That ought to be the qualification to enter prison. You've got to be a Christian.
