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ran for this office. He is still his own man. He represents the people who are his constituency, and not a political party or the head of a political party. And that would be a lesson all of us would do well to learn. I'm going to see how well the lesson he taught will take on my colleagues. The one I'm...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...trying to teach does not get anywhere. And the lesson that I'm trying to advocate for is that we should not sit in comfort in the presence of our brothers and sisters being discriminated against because of their sexual orientation. This bill escapes my clutches at this point, because I'm not going to continue offering amendments or motions to it. There are other fish in this barrel which I can attempt to fry. Mr. President, I will withdraw that motion.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item. That bill was returned, so we'll go on to LB 217E.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 217E. I do have a motion on the bill. Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers would move to return LB 217E to Select File for specific amendment. (FA1183, Legislative Journal page 656.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers to open on your motion to return LB 217 for Select.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we get a very large salary for working here. We make \$1,000 a month. And I want to earn that salary by doing what I was sent here to do. And I was sent here to inform myself on issues, to use my best judgment, then to advocate for those things that I believe in. So here is where we are in LB 217. On page 9, in line 24, after "8-701" I would add these words, "that has a policy prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation." If this seems like deja vu all over again, as Yogi Berra would say, you're correct. This is how the sentence would read if my language is inserted. "With the approval of the director, any banking institution as defined in section 8-701 that has a policy prohibiting discrimination based
