discriminated against because of sexual orientation, and I don't think it's a serious problem. If I didn't think it was serious, I wouldn't be taking all of my time and all of you all's time. But it is serious. And I'm not going to let you all get out from under it. I'm going to, whenever the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...spirit moves me, take a bill and offer what I call the Chambers rider, which will prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation. Am I going to be repetitive? Yes. The Colorado River taught me that. Just keep following the same path over and over, and don't give up, and that Grand Canyon will be produced. The day is going to come when this Legislature is going to do the right thing and prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation. And I'm going to say, like that little girl in the Shake 'n Bake commercial, Senator Cudaback, that's not fried chicken, that's Shake 'n Bake, and I helped.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone malfunction) ...motion.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That motion is withdrawn. We now return to Final Reading itself. The first vote will be to require a vote to suspend the at-large reading, pursuant to Rule 6 Section 8. All in favor of the motion to suspend the rules vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the motion to dispense at-large reading. Record please, Mr. Clerk. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to dispense with the at-large reading.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion to dispense with at-large reading was successful. Mr. Clerk, read the title.
