company. So this is about competition; protecting your own company. It's not about keeping any information from the public. I guarantee you I've looked at these models. They are extremely difficult to have and within the framework of the bill, even with the amendment there, the Department of Insurance reviews these models and protects our public. That's what our Department of Insurance is about. They will review the models and they will make sure that there is nothing in there that would be detrimental to our public, so I urge you to vote for the committee amendment. It makes everyone more comfortable with the bill and it does take us back to consistency with the national model. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Further discussion on the committee amendments to LB 487? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, Senator Redfield, if I could ask you a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Redfield?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: First of all, thank you for bringing the bill. I think there's a whole lot of good in it and I'm glad to see you promoting it and I think this is going to go much better than your endeavors of a day or two ago (laugh), I hope. I did want to ask a little bit about the committee amendment, though. The language that is being reinserted here, I understand, was part of the model act. Was it the exact language, the filings related to credit information?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Beutler, that only is about the model, the computer model, that would be filed with the Department of Insurance. It's just telling the Department of Insurance, you can't give that information out to the competitors. That's all it's about, is protecting you from your competitor.
