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SENATOR MOSSEY: I still believe it should be a Class IV felony for possessing child pornography.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It should be the same penalty as someone who's distributing it.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Actually, somebody distributing should be guilty of higher than a Class IV felony, but I'm not able to address that issue right now.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, until that issue is addressed, doesn't it make some sense to keep things in proportion so that you're not...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...penalizing somebody higher for a lesser offense?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Wehrbein. Senator Wehrbein. I don't think Senator Wehrbein is on the floor. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I applaud you, Senator Mossey, for bringing this bill. As I read, and you know more, much more, about the subject, just want to...is it a lot of it occurs on our computers on the Internet and so forth, this child pornography and so forth? Does this issue deal it...how do the police deal with that part of it? And maybe you did that when you're...you know, in your opening and so forth. Is this more of a federal...

SENATOR MOSSEY: Well...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...type of thing? So if you'd answer, take as much time as you want, but that's what I see from reading in the newspaper. It's more of an Internet type of things or broader than just, you know, the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Actually, to address that is to address Senator Beutler's comment. The manufacturing, distribution and selling
