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2006-2007. So we're still four years, five years away...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: ...from seeing any of those revenues. So it is interesting when we talk about this. A lot of people say, well, let's have casinos to help with the budget problem. And I remind them that that would help with the budget problem in 2008, not today. And I think some of that is driving this. But also, again, everybody always points to Council Bluffs. What are they doing? How has this benefitted them? How has this benefitted the state of Iowa? And I think Senator Jensen brought up a great point yesterday, and that is that the mayor of Council Bluffs is asking for another property tax increase, another one, meaning they've already done it once, and they're going to do it again. Now, the sheet that Senator Schimek passed out today said the gambling revenue benefits for Iowa. Currently, they put an additional \$9.3 million into the cities that have casinos in Iowa. So in addition to the supposed benefit of having those there, they're also increasing the property taxes that are there currently. Again, you know, to do the math on some of these things, don't make sense. I think the argument needs to be made. You put it before the people for the right reasons, and I can't...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR ERDMAN: ...find any of those right reasons at this time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Beutler, followed by eight others.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, I would yield my time to Senator Schimek.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Bourne, did you wish to follow up with any other questions on
