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suggesting that those should be put into our General Fund, or that that will help our budget woes, either now or in the future. And with that, Mr. President, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Bourne,...

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr...

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...on LR 14CA.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Again, I rise in support of the general concept of LR 14CA. But I am concerned about it being too restrictive. And I'm going to go through again what I've talked about, this limitation of counties receiving this revenue. And maybe I'm not making myself clear. But on page 3, starting in line 24, it says, "The Legislature shall allocate portions of the revenue from gaming under subsection (7) of this section to counties or other political subdivisions, except that such revenue shall not be allocated within any county in which gaming is conducted under subsection (7) of this section." So my point is this. Say that Senator Schrock has an amendment coming up, and I understand he's waived over it, but basically it would allow casinos in horse tracks. And one of the horse tracks that I'm aware of is in Hall County. So what this language here says is that if somehow Hall County obtains a...or gets a casino that's conducted there in that horse track, that they would not be able to share in any of the revenue allocated by the Legislature...any revenue that the Legislature may allocate from gaming could not go to Hall County. That's how I read it. And again, I don't want to, you know, keep harping on this, but I think it's of a major concern. Certainly those counties that might get casino gaming will enjoy some of the benefits. They absolutely will enjoy additional employment, things of that nature. But the reality is, is that the state will enjoy additional benefits as well, I believe, notwithstanding Senator Erdman's arguments. I do think that when there's additional jobs in Hall County, or additional jobs in Douglas County, the entire state enjoys the benefits of that, through additional income tax and things of that nature. I find this too
