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restrictive. And again, I understand the concerns with LR 11, that it's too broad. But I think there's just as many, if not more, concerns with LR 14, that it's too restrictive. And what we're doing is we're going to...assuming this is passed, we're going to rely on the Legislature to pass rules and laws, statutes, that allocate this money. And my fear, again, is, is that those counties that choose to go this route, Hall County, Douglas County, whatever other counties there might be, they will not be able to share in this revenue. This is too ambiguous language. It's ambiguous. Nobody knows what really this means. And if the Legislature then adopts statutes to further this or to allocate this money, it very well could be that there's impacts beyond what Senator Schimek is envisioning. So...and again, if she's interested in some sort of a compromise...and I'm not advocating that Hall County or Douglas County or any other county take more than their share of this revenue. I believe it should absolutely be allocated fairly throughout the state. But I am concerned with this language. Senator Schimek, if you'd like the balance of my time, you're welcome to it. But again, I want to hear, before I'm going to support this concept, I want to hear from you that you are willing to compromise on this point, that the entire state will share equally, meaning those counties that have the casinos and those counties that do not have the casinos will share equally. And if you're willing to compromise on that, I will support the concept.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You have about a minute and a half, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. And, Senator Bourne, I think I've already compromised on that. I think that's the intent of the language. The language may not say that. And one of the amendments that we are going to take up will indicate that this is the state's tax revenue we're talking about. And ordinarily, the state would just take all of that revenue for itself. But what I determined that we needed to do, based on my...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
