is, I don't want to get...I don't want to be a hypocrite about it. I can't look in the mirror in the morning and say that gambling is immoral. I've done it. I still do it. But I also believe, in this particular instance, if we can get something on the ballot that is palatable, we will find out whether this is something that can happen. SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Schimek?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: First of all, I believe that the people of Nebraska are not going to be willing to vote for something that is just wide open. I don't truly believe that. And secondly...and I think they would like to see parameters to this. They'd like to have some kind of idea what this...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...what this scheme is going to look like. And this does give some idea of what the scheme would look like.
