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She said, I have a lot of fun here. I come here once a week. I said, well, why are you playing the nickel slot machines? Because, said, they had some dollar machines here, but nobody would play them. Well, I understand that. I said, do you get a lot of enjoyment out of this? She said, I certainly do. I can buy a buffalo burger for a dollar, and a bottle of pop. They didn't sell alcohol in that casino. There was no alcohol at all there. But people enjoyed going to that. And they weren't spending their life savings there. This was a wake-up call to me, that people can enjoy themselves at an establishment like that and not hurt anybody, not even themselves. Absolutely, there are a few that do. I don't know what the percentage is, but it isn't that high. So we worked on this for a long time. And I hate that Senator Schimek and I are divided on this issue, but ultimately, we are both going to the same destination. It's which road you want to take to get there. The wake-up call came to the Legislature, in my opinion, with the advent of the petition that is out there. I don't like it, and I don't think any of you in this body like it either. But let me tell you something. This is the people's choice. They were disgusted with us up to the point that nothing was happening here, they took it in their own hands, and which they have every right to do. If we don't get something done here this year, if it's not that petition, it's going to be another one. And the next one that comes out you probably won't like any better than the first one. But the people in this state are fed up. They are fed up with us...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...for not doing something. My colleagues, whichever way you intend to go, just make sure that this body has control over what we do. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Jensen, followed by Senator Bromm, and five others. Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. First of all, I apologize. When referring to the movie the other day I said "where's the money." It's "show me the money" that was the statement that was made. And I still
