not ready to open this up for gambling for 18-year-olds. I think that would be a bad precedent.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: I...that's why I keep coming back to "show me the money." Now, Senator Schimek, I hope you will be able to answer a couple of things on your time. Actually, on page 4 of the bill, it talks about, if the tribe does not have a casino, that they will get 5 percent of such revenue. Is that 5 percent for each tribe, or is that 5 percent for all tribes? And if we do say that 5 percent for each tribe, four tribes, 20 percent, again, Iowa, 22 percent goes to the state, it would seem to me that only 2 percent then is going to be kept. We need to find out about that. And that's why I keep coming back to the money. You've got to show me that this is going to be an economic issue for the state of Nebraska or, my goodness, we should not enter into it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Bromm, followed by Senators Brashear, Schimek, Erdman, Tyson, Smith, Vrtiska, Redfield, and Baker. Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. I haven't spoken on this issue for a long time. But I wanted to try to take the opportunity to make a few comments. When I came into the Legislature, I came in generally not supportive of expanded gambling. We'd just had the vote on the issues of the lottery and that, and that passed. But as far as expanding that, generally not supportive of that, and have maintained that position up until not very long ago. And as I began to see that the momentum in Nebraska was such that people in Nebraska have strongly sent a message that they want the opportunity to make the decision on this, and they must make the decision, because it would require a change in our constitution, I have come to the conclusion that I am not going to be an impediment to the people having a chance to vote on this.
