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concerned about, it would be 5 percent of such revenue, meaning state tax revenue, and that would be for any tribe that decided they were not going to have a casino on their reservation land. So it conceivably could add up to 20 percent. Whether it would or not, I don't know. But it's...the idea behind it...and I don't know if that's the right percentage or not. The idea behind it was to provide some kind of an incentive so that we wouldn't have so many casinos. You could possibly, under this bill, the way it's structured, you could possibly have nine casinos. You could have five interdiction zone casinos, and then four reservation casinos. So that's why that language was put in there. I'm surprised we haven't had more discussion on that language so far. And I think we do need to discuss it. I don't know if the percentages are right, but that's the idea behind it. And it is the state tax revenue, not the casino revenues, that we're talking about here. So I hope that helps. There's a couple of other things that I would like to go into, and I don't know if I'll have time or not. But...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I don't know if you all...one minute? Well, then maybe I shouldn't go into what I would like to go into right now, Senator. But I know that you all have been getting some letters from Thurston County regarding expenses for Knox and Thurston County if indeed Indian reservations were established. And I would like to address that and tell you a little bit about what IGRA says, the national Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, and how they don't need to worry in their counties about that question. But I'll address that at another time. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. The issue before us is constitutional amendment LR 14. Senator Erdman, followed by Senator Tyson and others.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I rise briefly. Senator Loudon passed out a map to show you how this interdiction zone would work around the state. And with that, I will yield the rest of my time to Senator Brashear.
