SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, you have almost four and a half minutes.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, thank you, Senator Erdman. As I indicated previously, I'm very concerned about the interdiction zone. I understand that as we've drafted this we can only have one. Sounds very limiting. I understand that it can only be two miles wide. Again, sounds limiting. But I understand it can run along the entire border of Nebraska-South Dakota, Nebraska-Iowa, Nebraska-Kansas, Nebraska-Colorado. We abut Missouri, too. But it can't include Wyoming until Wyoming acts for and on its own behalf in the course of its own sovereignty, and that sovereignty. And then of course we have to act, because we locked ourselves in. In our wisdom, we've decided if Wyoming gets it, then we've got to have it. So we've got to then extend the interdiction zone. Nothing like giving away our options. We might want to retain some of our sovereignty. The...then of course...and I am just fascinated with what's going to happen to the price of real estate in that two-mile zone. (Laugh) I am. I just think it's...I can hardly wait to go find out what's going on out there in that two-mile strip. But of course, it's limited to five facilities. Gotcha. No definition of what a facility is. Anybody recall branch banking? Let's see, is a facility defined by who owns it, or where it's located, or what it does? And wouldn't you like to be involved in the argument over whether or not you can put a slot machine under a little hut, you know, a block away from the casino, so everybody can have one last pull as they drive away? Or maybe you can have five little branches or extensions or supplemental facilities sprinkled throughout the two-mile zone. You see, "facility" isn't defined here. So we, for and on behalf of the people, will have the pleasure of defining "facility" every time we meet. There will only be five, but it's all in how you define them. That will make the whole difference. I really don't think this interdiction zone is...in the constitution, is taking us where we want to go. And I notice that we are innocuously defining "gaming" in the constitution.
