business to Council Bluffs. And I think there will be significant social costs. I think Senator Tyson is exactly right, and Senator Jensen. They've beat that drum for years, and they're right. But I'd do it in Omaha. If you do it in Omaha, you do it in the Indian reservations, and I can live with that. If there is going to be something for that, I'd just as soon have some money for the racetracks, so that we can help the horse racing industry in this state. I think that would be a good thing for agriculture, and I think it would be a good way to disperse some of the benefits around the state in other locations where casinos are inappropriate. Do I need a two-mile strip all the way around the state? No. But I don't want video slots everywhere. I don't want to get people in the business of having gambling everywhere. I'd just as soon control it geographically for this reason. The evidence is overwhelming that the availability of gambling increases the amount of gambling. It's not as if that there's a set sum of gambling that would be done, and you just have to figure out how you're going to do it, or where it's going to go to run its course. If you pass six lottery locations on the way home, you are more likely to gamble than if you pass one lottery place on the way home. If you walk into restaurant or bar after bar and there's a video slot,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...it's more likely you will gamble than if there's only one every now and then. In other words, access breeds consumption. It's true in alcohol. It's true in gambling. It's true in a number of the sins, if you will. Which is why a limited approach, for me, is the best. I can live with that. I intend to vote for LR 14CA. But ultimately, here's what I'm endorsing. I'm endorsing, and I believe in, and think it would be appropriate for a casino in Omaha, on the Indian reservations, and something for the racetracks. I could live with that, and I think the public would endorse it as well. Under those conditions, and looking towards that, I'm supporting LR 14CA, reluctantly.
