SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, what's the operative protocol? We're on the amendment only, by the iron fist of the Chair? I'm teasing. I want to rise...I know this will touch Senator Schimek deeply. I want to rise in support of Senator Schimek's amendment, the amendment to the bill. The amendment, for all the reasons she explained, is a good thing. We are improving the bill. I've always believed in the concept of adopting worthwhile amendments...don't be offended, Senator Schimek...even to improve a bad bill, because we should always make the bill better. I was taught that when I first came here. This amendment makes LR 14CA better. It gets rid of that entire concept of letting somebody else be in control of a definition within our very important constitution. And so I urge the adoption of AM0560. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Schimek, your light is next. She waives. Senator Erdman, on the bill. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: (Microphone malfunction) On the bill also. I'll...I don't want to speak on the amendment. I'll pass.
