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speak to the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Okay. According to the list I have, all persons remaining whose lights are on wish to speak to the bill. If I am mistaken, please raise your hand, or do what Senator Brashear was doing. (Laugh) Otherwise, Senator Schimek, you'd be recognized to close on AM0560.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, members. All I am trying to do with this amendment is to insert the word "casino" before "gaming," wherever it appears in this bill, and to identify that the revenues we are talking about are state tax revenues, and to make sure that the definition for casino gaming is consistent throughout the bill. So with that, I would just encourage your support. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. You've heard the closing. The question then is the adoption of AM0560. All in favor vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Schimek's amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have Senator Schrock's amendment, but I'm not sure if he wants to take that up.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock previously advised he wished to pass over it. So I think we'll go back to the bill. And the first light would be Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. It's been so long, I kind of forgot what I was going to talk about, but maybe it will come to me. Seriously, I've been listening...and this is the first time I've spoken on this bill, and I've been listening very carefully to the discussion, because I know this is certainly an important issue that's come before this Legislature this year. And it should be carefully debated, so that people can feel, when they leave here, that they've done the right
