have another constitutional amendment to put on the ballot for people to vote on it? I'm not sure about that either. But I want to talk a little bit about my meeting in Broken Bow this last weekend with the chamber meeting there. And there was a lot of people showed up there. And one couple came up, and they only had one question: do you support the gambling constitutional amendments? And I said, no. And they said, good, I'm glad to hear that. And there was not one person around the whole table that supported it. So I feel pretty comfortable in my district. The only comments that I really heard in my district is talk about Valentine. I got a casino in my...not in my district, but just one foot from my district. Rosebud. They just built it with one foot of the border up there. And I was up there visiting up there, and somebody took me up to show me what the situation was. And we went up there. As we went in, two people was coming out. And so he told me afterwards, he said, you know who them two people was? I said, no. He told me, he said, one of them had lost his driver's license, and the other one was on welfare. And he said, that's the problem. He says, the welfare people are going there more than the people that's got money. The welfare dollars are our dollars to start out with. And the businesses in town suffered because of that, because the grocery stores still do good, a lot of the other places, but there's a lot of the businesses don't do good, just because they're spending their money up there. I think Vrtiska said it right when he says it just kind of puts the money someplace else, just displaces it. And I've heard...I'd like to get some data on it...but I heard that South Dakota, it cost them more last year than they took in, because of the social problems. And I'd like to have some figures on that before I'd want to be quoted on that. But we got to think about what we're putting in our constitution. That really bothers me. And another thing I've heard here this morning that said if we don't put something on the ballot they'll run a petition, I think they're going to run a petition even if we do put something on the ballot. If they don't like the way this is worded, they'll go right ahead and put something on the ballot anyway. So that's another thing that I think that we really got to think about when we're doing this, because I don't think that's going to solve the problem. And is this going to solve our money problems?
