amendment. So we have discussed LR 14CA all day yesterday or all morning yesterday, and part of the morning before, and, basically to remind you, this is the constitutional amendment with the provision in it for tribal casino gaming and for the interdiction zone. And I think that will probably be enough for me to say at this point, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, I need to make a personal statement right off the bat this morning. Yesterday, many of you recall I spent time with each one of you. I got through 26 or 27 of you, I think, discussing a strategy whereby both bills would be...both casino bills would be advanced to Select File. And at the time that I did that, I honestly believed that I had the support of Senator Schimek and Senator Janssen in promoting that method of dealing with the bills. But as it turned out, I had misunderstood Senator Janssen, and he did not support that tactic. And so I want to be clear with you that Senator Janssen did not support that, and I want to apologize for the misunderstanding to the extent it was my misunderstanding. Those things happen. But I hope you will understand that I honestly mistook his intent. Otherwise, I wouldn't have spent an entire morning on a tactic that (laugh) took the approval of two different people to really pull off. So I know that I needed to say that because many of you would have been wondering what the heck was going on with regard to that. So there is no agreement on that particular procedure. Thank you. And, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, with that I would yield the remainder of my time to Senator Schrock.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Before proceeding, that's exactly what I was going to do; Senator Schrock, would you like to give us a brief status update on the amendment?

SENATOR SCHROCK: The amendment that I have offered to the floor of the Legislature would allow casinos at the five horse tracks that we have in the state of Nebraska. I thought it was an important amendment because I do believe in the destination
