casino. I have always told most of my constituents and I think most of them concur with me, unless they are bar owners or run a bowling alley, that I thought any expansion of gambling in this state should be places where people have to make a decision to go there, that it isn't popping up right in front of them. And so that's the reason I offered the racetrack amendment. It does give a chance to spread out the locations. It gives central Nebraska a place where they may want to go and do this type of activity, and it also helps the racetracks which has been a part of our state for over 70 years. Parimutuel betting has been...well, I'd say over 60 years. It also mirrors what takes place in Iowa because the greyhound track at Council Bluffs and the horse track at Des Moines do offer the slot machines. It has really added to their...to their purses. It has added to the quality of their races. And I would say, probably, that activity was probably one of the reasons that Ak-Sar-Ben didn't stay open. And so I think if race tracks are going to be competitive, and I think they are and will be, but I think also it's a logical place for this type of activity. They are agricultural societies and any profit...they are nonprofit associations. With that, that will kind of bring you up to date where we are on the amendment.
