SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. Senator Beutler, it seems to me that you did vote for the amendments on Senator Schimek's bill, and this amendment is practically word for word what hers was. Pretty close. The definition, the definitions of, according to Webster, dice according to Webster means the plural of die. It is a small cube marked on each face with the form of one to six spots and used usually in pairs in various games, and in gambling by taking and thrown to come to rest at random on a flat surface. Games of chance in Nebraska case law, it has been defined as a game with three elements of consideration, chance, and a prize, and in which chance, rather than skill, determines the outcome. So you have to give... pay to something to participate. Chance rather than skill determines the outcome, and the participant could win a prize such as money. Gaming, defined by Black's law, to mean the practice or act of gambling; an agreement between two or more persons to play together at a game of chance for a sake of wager which is to become the property of the winner, and to which all contribute. The elements of the game... gaming are the presence of the price or consideration, chance and prize or rewards. I just have a high school education, Senator. You have a law degree. They are in the dictionary. These are the terms. Mechanical according to Webster to mean also gaming... according is related to governing... governed by or in accordance with the principles of mechanics. Mechanics means a branch or physical science that deals with energy and force and their efforts on bodies. And you look back at the constitutional question that was given to the voters on the lottery. I have it right here. A constitutional amendment to authorize the Legislature, to authorize the Legislature to establish a lottery which is operated and regulated by the state, which is operated and regulated by the state. That was the ballot question. That is actually simpler than the ballot question that I have. So we'll probably argue this for the next four or five days, but that's what it says. And I believe, have we changed anything on the lottery since then? Very little. We had the opportunity to do it, chose not to. So I ask you, again,...
