should vote for this amendment if you want some limitation and not some misconstruction of the intent of this amendment in the constitution. Having said that then I would like to concentrate just a little bit on some of the discussion. We have said again and again that maybe we could limit this by being more specific in number of locations or two miles within the border, five miles within the border, and that's all good and fine, I think, but I would just be so hesitant to have that in the constitution as a limiting factor. Let me give you an example. Who would have thought that out in the middle of the Sandhills we would have a destination golf course? If you told me that 10 years ago, 15 years ago, I would have said you're nuts. We have a golf course out there almost no one can find that people from all over the country fly into. You can hardly get on the course and it's a great thing. It's a great thing for Nebraska and I don't think it's been a bad thing for the Sandhills. I think it's been a good thing there too. Now, if we had been foolish enough at some point to say you can only have golf courses in certain areas or within one mile of a city of 5,000 or more, some such silly thing as that, we'd be kicking ourselves all the way across the state of Nebraska. So I think it is important to think in terms of the long term. And the concept, the basic idea is, do we want to have casino-type gambling in Nebraska or don't we, or do we want to allow the people to decide if they want casino-type gaming or not? That is the...that's the bottom line question. And if you think not, that you don't want to give them the chance to vote on that, you should vote against this or any other proposal that's close to this. But if you want to give the people a chance to vote on it, I don't think we should get hung up and stalled on whether it's two miles, three miles, four casinos, six casinos, a one-mile radius. I think that's just not...I don't think that's good legislating and I don't think it's...that will get something done here. I don't think we've got the time to do it right if we're going to craft all of the details and parameters...
