gamblers, which represents a minimal social cost of \$212 million. All right, so now you know that amount. Their idea or their research shows that for every dollar that you spend in treatment, if you will, minimizes social costs by \$4. So then you figure out how much money we should actually be considering. We're going to generate all this money to the state of Nebraska. We're going to generate all this money for all these great programs, as handed out by some of these outlandish claims from some of these groups that want to come in here and steal money from our citizens and send it to Vegas, is that if you divide the \$212 million by 4, you'll find out approximately how much money we should be spending annually for those who are in existing problems in the state of Nebraska. What is that? What's 20 divided by 4? All right. So you figure that out and I'll grab the sheet, and so you're supposed to spend about \$50 million a year, supposed to. In Iowa, they spend \$2.8 million a year on gambling assistance or treatment programs, so even though they generate \$215 million in revenue, supposedly, which is, again, hard to actually figure out how that's true, they spend \$2.8 million for treatment. Now, in the state of Nebraska, we don't have casinos and if we spent \$2.8 million and we wouldn't even come close. We're spending about 20 percent. No, excuse me, we're spending about one-twentieth of what we should be spending to actually accomplish the purpose of taking care of those who are already here. The other argument that I think is interesting is that other states have this, we need it. The impact on the economy is going to be unbelievable. One, there's not another business that we recruit in the state of Nebraska that doesn't have a product to sell. This doesn't have a product to sell. It absolutely does not. The end result or the by-product that you get from having a nice destination casino or any other casinos in Nebraska is bankruptcy, divorce, abuse, and addiction. And everybody will yell and scream about all the other businesses that we have in the state of Nebraska, but most people aren't addicted to going to the super store and buying whatever it is that's there. They might like to go to those places, but they're not addicted to it. But the other side of that is, is that...
