very often on this issue, but I would like to tell you, for those of you who don't know it, I've basically been campaigning the last three years and I found exactly as Senator Friend told us about yesterday when he went to the doors, the number of people that was the number one issue that was brought up. And it seems to me the people out there are absolutely furious at the Legislature because we don't let them vote on this issue. I can't tell you the number of times that I've heard, if you let us vote on it and it fails, that's fine, but why do you always think you know better than us? So...and I know there's the argument on the other side that we're here and we see more of the information, but I feel I was elected to represent the people and they're very adamant about this. Now I am also on the General Affairs Committee. I am a cosponsor of both of these bills that we're hearing. I would tell you my preference is the bill we're hearing right now, LR 11CA, but my number one concern is that we get together and we do something, that we put something on the ballot for the people to vote on, because it's going to be hard for me to go home to my district and say we did it again. So I would just hope that we could all get together and work on that, and I would also hope that whatever goes on the ballot comes from this body instead of the petition process. Because when it comes from our body, we're going to control the regulation, the revenue, the expenditures. We're going to have money for problem gambling. You all know in the petition that was before us there wasn't a lot of those things, so I hope that we can get together and do that. And if Senator Janssen would like the remainder of my time, I would yield it to him.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, Senator Cunningham is yielding you the rest of his two and a half minutes, if you care to use it. I do not see...yes, Senator.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Senator Cunningham. How much time do I have left, Senator Cudaback? Two minutes? Three minutes? Okay. Thank you. I'll take up where I was... where I left off. Some states do not use...some states will...they'll differ in how they use those revenues that are generated from this type of gaming.
