good idea. But the problem is or the thing is, this isn't a hurry up kind of job. The other thing I think we really need to be thinking about, and that is the enabling legislation, and I truly believe that the people of this state will not vote on any constitutional amendment out there unless you have the enabling legislation and, believe me, that is going to be the hardest piece of this whole thing. If you think this is difficult, wait till we get to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the enabling legislation and trying to figure out what the process will be for somebody being able to establish a casino in this state. We need to...we need to know what that process is going to be. We need to figure that out ahead of time. We need to talk about the revenues. We need to figure that out ahead of time. We need to decide all those detailed kinds of questions in enabling legislation, and it is my personal preference at least that we do this ahead of time, that we do it ahead of putting a constitutional amendment on the ballot. Because I have to tell you, very frankly, I would personally have a lot of difficulty voting for anything that goes on the ballot without the enabling legislation being done ahead of time. And I don't know how you feel...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...about it, but I would...you're speaking very quietly this morning, Senator Cudaback. Did you say time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I did, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry. Senator Kremer, on the committee amendments to LR 11CA.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. I won't necessarily speak just to the committee amendments, but to the overall concept. I've...people debate this, but tried to keep an open mind on this, and for a year or so I've been
