keeping a file on everything that I could find. But I'll have to admit that when you have a belief one way that you tend to file the material that support your belief and so that's somewhat what I've done. But just a few comments on what I think is interesting. When I see that we have lobbyists from the Venetian and the Las Vegas Sands and you would wonder why they are so concerned about Nebraska. It kind of makes me wonder. And I did read last year where Iowa sent...I think around \$46 million was sent out of state to Las Vegas and Louisiana just to operate their casinos. That doesn't sound like a good investment. And I thought it was interesting the study that the Omaha Chamber of Commerce had done about some of the aspects of the gambling, and there were many things that were positive in there. As far as even in Omaha, they would create jobs and there would be new sales. But thing that was kind of interesting to me, it said for Nebraska outside of Omaha, yearly operation of an Omaha, Nebraska, casino is expected to reduce yearly wages and salaries by \$6.3 million, yearly sales by \$24.7 million, and jobs by \$617. And it had a footnote where they got that information. It said an Omaha, Nebraska, casino would likely increase yearly crime rate by 1.5 percent to 7.9. That's quite a wide range, but they are recognizing that there are some other things in there. The Scottsbluff Star-Herald, I believe it is, just had an editorial in there that...from their perspective. It just says, it appears that the pie-in-the-sky promises of everything from big jackpots to property tax relief are blinding most Nebraskans to the social ills accompanying it. And they said, if it's going to happen why don't we just learn how to run the casinos from what Iowa does rather than having people from Las Vegas come in to run them? Another thing, it was just interesting talking to some people, as many times I talked to people from other states and just got their opinion of what it's done for their state. I was in the State Capitol last fall on a Saturday when Nebraska was playing McNeese State, and a group of about eight people came into the Capitol and I just happened to walk there past them and they said, how can we get a tour of the Capitol and find out about this, and I asked them where they were from and they said they were from Lake Charles. And I mentioned that I was there once and had a beautiful big bridge going over the bay and the area around that was so nice, and it didn't take them
