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and we don't want it to pass. I said, you know what? We need to let the people vote on it. They're going to get the opportunity whether the Legislature passes it or not, and at that point my vote won't mean any more than anybody else's. I do support it on the floor. I do support it to go to the vote of the people. Will a lot of people vote for it when it gets there? Who knows? But they want that opportunity to get to vote on it. And if they vote it down, I think the issue of gambling will go away for a while. Will it come back? Yeah, probably will, but not for a while. And we're getting enough heat from the people out in the districts, out in the communities, across the state of Nebraska to just let them vote on it. And I believe that if the Legislature has a plan, we will have the best plan out there. And if they're going to vote for it, they're going to look at what the Legislature has to offer. I guess the second thing that I look at is why do people gamble in the first place? I know, yes, there are some people that are addicted to it, and they're addicted to it already. They have opportunities of keno, they have the opportunity of going out of state, they have the lottery, and they also have the Internet. I'm an investment rep and I received some... a fax not too long ago across my desk of how I could sell stocks with a company that is involved in interstate... or, excuse me, Internet gambling, and that stock, if you believe it, has grown immensely because of the people that are gambling on the Internet. Can we stop that? No, we can't. So we already have the gambling, but do we have any thing or any type of funding to help those people that are gambling? They go out of state. We still have the issues with it, but we don't have any type of way to pay for that addiction. If we pass something, then we need to make sure that we take care of those people. They're not being taken care of now. And all I ask is when we put together a plan which is the best plan out there, that we do something for those addicted people. We know that it will happen. It's a given. The petition drives that are out there, do they allow something for those people that are addicted? I don't know, and I'm guessing they probably don't, because those that write the bill will benefit from the bill. And will they take care of those that have compulsive problems? Probably not. But when we write our type of issue and our type of legislation, we need to make sure that those people are covered. Thank you.
