quite simple and it just follows up on what Senator Raikes was talking about a little bit. On the E & R amendments, on Section 2, it will read: "training required by subdivision (1)(e) of this section may be," and then I inserted "in whole," "may be waived in whole or in part," "in whole or in part." In other words, they may waive all of the requirements or they may...for training, or they may waive just a couple hours or a small amount. But it just gives the department the flexibility. They can look at this on a case-by-case situation and decide if they would waive all the requirements or just part of them. That's all the bill does...or the amendment does. I would just ask for its approval. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. You heard the opening on FA1186. Open for discussion. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, just briefly I rise in support of Senator Jensen's amendment. I do think that it does clarify specifically what it is we're trying to accomplish and that is the department having the flexibility to look at an individual case and determine what their training needs are, and then giving them the flexibility of making sure that those individuals either have the minor part of training that they need or that they have the ability to prove that they don't need any training. So it provides clarification. I support it and I would encourage you to do the same.
