be entitled to try to obtain custody of the child. Is that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: I could imagine that, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would each one be entitled to qualify as a parent, as a foster parent, for a relative's child without taking this training if they are no longer married?

SENATOR JENSEN: We have two categories in here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me...let me make it more clear. Let's say that we're going to look at the family on the side of the woman. All right? Now, if somebody on her side has a child which is going to go into foster care, as long as the two homosexual people, one male and one female, are married to each other, they are, by marriage, related to the family on the woman's side where the child involved is located. Do you follow me?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would their being gay prohibit them from being foster parents to this child?

SENATOR JENSEN: The bill talks about what is in the best interests of the child and I think that's the determining factor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you be willing...are you on this bill as a cosponsor?

SENATOR JENSEN. No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I'll keep asking...

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I'll take that back. Yes, I am.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. That Sam I am, that Sam I am, I do not like that Sam I am.
