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include that in there, having that practice. And, Senator Chambers, we can get you information directly from the department if you would like because, when your question did come up, I went and asked the individuals from the department who are here and that was the example that they gave me. They said that they're willing to talk with you about that, either through this process or whatever. But the process is in place. There's nothing that prohibits them from doing that. But the limiting factor is, again, whether they're a relative or not, and that is the limiting factor for everyone in the state of Nebraska if they're not married, regardless of what their sexual orientation is. So from that standpoint, I think that what you're asking for is already in practice. There is essentially no discrimination on that standpoint. And if there is discrimination, it's not against them. It's against anyone who's not married, from that standpoint, so it wouldn't be technically a specialized case where those individuals are singled out. So from that standpoint, I think it's in place as far as the practices of the state of Nebraska, and I would offer that it probably isn't necessary to be included in this legislation. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I'm aware, Mr. President. I may have to offer an amendment to continue this discussion. Senator Erdman, I'd like to ask you a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman, would you respond?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What I'm looking at is whether or not a person's sexual orientation will be considered in determining suitability. So what I am talking about, even though what you said is correct, that's why I went into the issue of homosexual people being married legally, not to each other as members of the same sex, but a male homosexual married to a female homosexual, or one homosexual partner married to a heterosexual of the opposite sex. What I want to guard against is sexual
