SENATOR MINES: Yes. Yes. But again, there's...from a local perspective...and I think we've had other senators concerned about greater Nebraska sharing in the opportunity to have gaming at the local level. And I think this excludes and it doesn't...I don't think it excludes...it does exclude those...that interest.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It says that our policy shall not be to have casinos in every community and every county in Nebraska. Yes.

SENATOR MINES: Right. Right. And I agree with that as well. And I guess finally, the...and I understand that the authorization of gaming, the locations themselves, will be a process that this Legislature will undertake at a later time. But it appears to me that once we limit...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR MINES: ...and we must be very aware that as we limit, all the kids are going to be in line. And it will be a...it will be an overwhelming and...it will be an impossible task to select eight good sites, because you're going to have, in my opinion, you're going to have people from all over...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I think that's right. And I wouldn't necessarily envision this Legislature...we would set the policy, but we wouldn't necessarily set the sites. I mean, it depends on what the Legislature wants to do. But I would envision some kind of a commission or agency which actually does that outside of the political arena, if you will.

SENATOR MINES: And I hope that happens as well. And again, I'm going to support this. And I think it's important. At least, I've heard on...from my constituents. And it's important that they be allowed to vote on expanded gambling or gaming. And I commend the committee on their work. Thank you, Mr. President.
