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Legislature. Senator Bourne, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN: You said that you would yield to a question, so I've got a question for you.

SENATOR BOURNE: Well, I didn't mean to say that I was the drafter of this, Senator. I just...

SENATOR ERDMAN: Oh, no, no, no. I'm not going to ask you a really tough question here.

SENATOR BOURNE: Fair enough.

SENATOR ERDMAN: All right. Here we go. Senator Bourne, what do you think the odds are of this proposal passing?

SENATOR BOURNE: (Laugh) I have no idea.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Do you think the odds of this proposal passing is better than the original proposal in LR 11CA?

SENATOR BOURNE: Well, I think, Senator Erdman, that we heard some concerns on the floor, legitimate concerns, I might add, that expressed that they didn't...people didn't necessarily want slot-type...or, this type of activity to be on every corner of every street in the state. And I think that's a legitimate concern. And so that was something we heard...seemed to hear over and over, that this has to be a rifle approach rather than a shotgun approach. And I think this amendment accomplishes that.

SENATOR ERDMAN: All right. Thank you, Senator Bourne. Just so you know, Senator Bourne is now a registered bookie at the Nebraska Legislature, and handicapping this race. You know, it is interesting. I think Senator Schimek had a great quote when she was having a discussion with Senator Mines. She says, well, that's not the way that I envision it. Think about that for a
