to be there, is that correct?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No. We...I mean the state would have...the city or county would have to apply to the state for the permission to put a casino in there, but they could do that under this provision without taking a vote of the people. They could do it through their county board, or their city council, or whatever.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay. And I've asked the question before, and I only bring it back up of because what has happened in many, many other states. We have four recognized tribes in the state of Nebraska, and there are no others out there. There isn't some tribe that might come in and say we were in Nebraska. In 1642 we were there, we are a tribe of Nebraska.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: There are...there is the Sac Fox tribe of Kansas which has some land that comes up into Nebraska, and one of the things that we had in my resolution said that it would only be the federally recognized tribes who had land held in trust for purposes of gaming and who were headquartered in Nebraska. We were very specific in that amendment, in LR 14CA.

SENATOR JENSEN: But that's not in this one.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is not in this one and I would assume that you would put it into statute.

SENATOR JENSEN: I really have great concern about that. There was...I know right now there is a tribe who has purchased land in downtown Kansas City,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...who says that we want to establish a casino down there. That was certainly not part of the original compact, I think, that was set forth in Kansas City. or in Kansas.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator, are they having any success with that? I think it's a very, very problematic process.
