SPEAKER BROMM:        Thank you, Senator Price.    Senator Smith, you have about 1 minute and 29 seconds.

SENATOR SMITH:        Thank you, Mr. Speaker and Senator Price.    I rise to add some details, and I don't want to bring the Omaha World-Herald editorial into it or the research that they've done, but I think it is interesting that there are so many details in the numbers and the numbers say a lot.    In fact, it's probably already been pointed out but I would like to add emphasis that, of Iowa's 14 mid-size cities, the 4 with casinos are at the bottom of the list in taxable retail sales growth.    This has taken place over the last several years.    It's in the details.    We have a limited number of dollars in our economy.    Are some of them going to Iowa right now?    Sure.    We can't dispute that.    Research will show that.    But if we expand gambling in Nebraska with more casinos, the most addictive form of gambling, that in being slot machines, we will cannibalize our own economy.    It speaks for itself, and those numbers certainly show that the end result will be that more money will leave the Nebraska economy.    It will go to Vegas, it will go to special interests outside Nebraska, and I think that we can do better, as constituents have told me, who moved from Iowa to western Nebraska,...

SPEAKER BROMM:        Time.

SENATOR SMITH:        ...from Council Bluffs, Iowa, to western Nebraska.    We can do better.    Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM:        Thank you, Senator Smith.    Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT:     Mr. Speaker, members of the body, Senator Schimek, maybe you can answer some questions.    I don't see senator...I guess Senator Janssen is there.
