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result of being in the Legislature, I used to think bingo was a Catholic saint. I would go past all these churches and I'd see bingo, and I thought the churches were named after Saint Bingo, and what really convinced me of it, Senator Bourne, trying to ignore me, was when I heard the hymn. They had a hymn that was written and it was catchy and it went for Saint Bingo: (singing) b-i-n-g-o, b-i-n-g-o, b-i-n-g-o, Saint Bingo was his name, oh. I said these Catholics are starting to kind of get in the flow of things. Then I had it brought home to me that there is no Saint Bingo. That song that you're singing is not about a saint. It's about a little puppy dog. And I was mortified, Senator Bourne, but I came out of that. When I listen to debates on the floor of the Legislature, I don't see how there can be an opposition to any kind of gambling when people's church engages in gambling, their social clubs, other so-called charitable groups gamble. So for somebody like me, without an ounce of religion, it's difficult for me to reconcile those things, but religious people have a way of letting the devil and God live and peacefully coexist in the same heart. They will be swearing like a sailor one second and in the next one talking about the grace of their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. And I say I don't really grasp or understand religion or religious people. Senator Schimek, in her naivete, wondered how the World-Herald could write one article for one side of the river, and a different article on the other side of the river. Senator Schimek, that's called speaking out of both sides of the mouth. They speak one thing on the left side of their mouth, the World-Herald, and a contrary thing out of the right side of their mouth. You have to realize that when large amounts of money are involved, editorial staffs, newspaper owners and others who are addicted to that cash are not going to have any trouble doing things to protect the income that they have and keeping out the competition. So if you can show, even indirectly, an interest that the World-Herald or people involved with the World-Herald have in the gambling occurring on the Iowa side of the river, it is not difficult to understand why they would editorialize, rail against and try to do everything they can to make sure no competition comes into being. This is an economic issue, just as I'm going to be able to demonstrate when we get to it that the matter of how athletes are treated in big-time college football is an economic issue.
