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particular instance, I don't think that that can...they can be defended, in the sense that they are trying to make it sound like Nebraska is the first one that's considering expansion of gambling, and that there's no gambling in Nebraska right now, that this is something that we've just dreamed up to do, totally on our own, without any instigation from outside the legislative body. None of those things are true. I mean, we have gambling, we have many different forms of gambling, we have illegal gambling, we have gambling in other states. We know that there are financial issues in...that are affecting our communities that have to do with money that's going to another state. We know that that other state just voted overwhelming to support it, partly because they know that their money is imported. So those...to be unaware of those issues, or to act like that they don't exist, I think is disingenuous. But I also think it's disingenuous for us not to deal with the revenue side of it in this discussion, because that has to be a piece of it. I agree very much with Senator Maxwell that it is not going to solve any of the issues that we are facing economically in the state. It may in some small way address it. But it's certainly not going to solve it. But I don't know that by us making one institution, whatever that institution is, in the state, who...an issue on this floor, I don't think is the right way to approach it. I am still struggling with this, struggling with knowing exactly what the right answer is. How do we best address the issues of our communities? Do we do that by having the money come to the state and then redistributing it for those communities that were receiving money? How do we maximize the amount of money that the state is going to get in this process that Senator Chambers, I think, has done a pretty good job of making the case that the house always wins? Well, we're going to try to make the state win as much as possible. But how we do that is not always easy. So I will continue to listen, continue to listen to this discussion. I think it's helpful that Senator Brashear had brought up some issues that...

SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...we are trying to clarify. But I think we still have an awful lot that needs to be clarified. Even if you could get past the black and white, do you like gambling, don't
