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But the scale goes from the lower income up to the higher income. So that is something for you to think about. We think about...we hear that it's going to be the poor people are the ones that are going to suffer. Well, this is a pretty reputable chart that I've got, and it shows you that the dollars are more above, on the higher end. Also, in Nebraska the percentage of the people in the state that go to the casinos, at a rate of about 1.8 percent that go out of state and participate. And the number...

SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...that number of gamblers...did you say time, Senator?

SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, okay. Okay, thank you. Is about 376,000 people, during the year. And the highest percentage of those that...where they go, is to Council Bluffs. Seventy-three percent of the people that go out of state to gamble go to Council Bluffs. And that's...you know, that's very understandable, because we have the proximity of the city of Omaha, where most of the population is at. It's understandable. The...in South Dakota, at the Indian casinos, is about nine percent. Kansas gets about eight percent of the people; Las Vegas, three; and the Iowa Indian casinos,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Time, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...two. But these are things that I want you to be aware of. Thank you.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you, Senator Janssen. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I would respectfully call the question.

SENATOR HARTNETT: The question has been called. All in favor signify. What? Do I see five hands? I see five hands. All in
