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put something on I'm not sure about, I would withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend, FA1189. (Legislative Journal page 738.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I hope I've drafted this to the right amendment. What I want to do, members of the Legislature, because I'm looking at the amendment numbered AM0656, that was adopted the other day and I guess became the bill. So if you turn to page 2 of that amendment, and you'll see it on your gadget, in line 20, on page 2, I would put a period after "Nebraska", and strike the remaining language. The language I'm striking is the following. Quote, when such gaming is conducted in accordance with federal law. I need to ask Senator Janssen a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Janssen, would you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, I'm on page 2, in line 20. I would put a period after the word "Nebraska", and strike the remaining language through line 21. That language is, quote, when such gaming is conducted in accordance with federal law. Why is that language that I'm proposing to strike included in this amendment?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator, can I have just a second here?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure. If you'd like me to ask Senator Schimek, because she's sitting right there ready to go?

SENATOR JANSSEN: If you would.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schimek.
