the fee structure also included...they took the cost of the...of inspecting every different device, and put the cost on that device. So some of them went up quite a bit, some of them didn't go up a lot, because maybe the scales in an elevator took a lot more time and cost to inspect than what a little scale in your grocery store does. Well, I think some progress was made in those areas. But I thank you for your concern on that. Thank you. I'll yield the balance of my time back to the Chair, or to Senator Baker, whoever wants it.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Kremer. The Chair would recognize Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I am going to echo what Senator Janssen said. These are fees that are going to go back on the consumer. I guarantee it. I question whether they're needed. It seems like the people who work closest with the folks out in the country probably realize what's going on. That would be Senator Janssen and my...actually, my staff and people, manager. There are some efficiencies to be had out there. I'm simply putting the department on notice. I want to see some efficiencies occur out there. We'll be back on this. I don't have much sympathy for asking to raise fees and pass them on to the people when I know good and well there's some things to be done out there to increase efficiency. So I simply want to put that of record, and I will be watching. Thank you.
