power trying to deal with a not-for-profit entity. Okay, that's fine. But we're not restricting this in any way as to whether it's...public or private, by the way, doesn't define not for profit, so maybe it should say public or private to include not for profit. And then it says...I do, by the way, know that in the last sentence this is all limited to the operation of a nuclear power plant, and we'd only have so many of those, so that's sort of restrictive. But the concept of putting in statute that one of our public bodies may, by its board, all of which serve on a part-time and relatively uncompensated basis, may put in place a contract which contains a provision that indemnifies a private entity from its own negligence sounds like an unlimited guarantee by the public treasury of a private entity's operation to such an extent that if you look down the road there won't be much incentive for them to do it very well. They can be just...I'm not saying anybody would be, but we're saying we're going to give a private entity a blank check and they can be about as sloppy, careless, negligent as they could possibly be, and that would be all right because we'd make them whole. Now, ordinarily, those of us who come from that point of view argue that we ought to privatize things; it increases accountability, responsibility; it introduces the profit motive, all those kinds of things. We're taking all that away. It's...I cannot read this but to say it is a blank check, and if it said indemnify a not for profit, I might have been more inclined to let it go by, but I'm beginning to wonder if this is the kind of innocuous, general, broad authorizing legislation that we want to put in the statute and then just move on. And General File is the place, I think, to send the signal. I'm not trying to stop anything, but I'm raising the issue. I certainly feel a duty and responsibility...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...to become a great deal more informed and this is my way of joining with the debate and being eligible, so to speak, to come back and speak on Select File. I'm not trying to do any damage, but I'm trying to be careful and prudent. And I thank you very much.
