They would have allowed him to make money through the use of his name and his likeness in connection with skiing. The NCAA said no, even though it had nothing to do with football, nothing whatsoever. SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...he is not eligible to play football. So there are restrictions on the athletes which would not be tolerated if they were placed on students across the board. And I hope that answers the question.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. President, members of the body, it's been a very interesting discussion this morning, and I know this is...this has been an issue been coming for the last several years. Many would not go to school, would not be able to afford an education without that athletic scholarship, but they do sacrifice a lot, and we do know that. And so, therefore, it's that desire, I think, that brings more people down to the University of Nebraska than any other thing because of our reputation as a strong football team. And, of course, we've had one bad year but our reputation over the years we have had national distinction for many, many years.
