hanging out there if they have an injury that's ongoing after they sustained it. Is that correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: All right. Thank you. The only other problem...and I don't have a problem. I shouldn't say it's a problem. The only other issue that I think maybe I would like to visit a little bit about, and that has to do with the money that's generated by the football team. Now, we generate a lot of money, as you've indicated, with the football program here in Nebraska. Some of the other schools probably don't generate that much. But my question, or discussion, surrounds around the fact that if, heaven forbid, Nebraska become a less dominant member in the football annals, and in fact doesn't make the kind of money, and we're paying this out, does that mean that we're going to...some of the other programs are going to suffer? I'm talking about where we support swimming and all the other programs that we support at the university. If the dollars...and we hope it never happens. But if it would happen, does that mean some of those programs are going to suffer because we're paying out money to those that are participating in football?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, the way the language of the bill reads, the university sets the amount of the stipend. If less money is available,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...it can be reduced.

SENATOR VRTISKA: So they can change that at any time they feel it is necessary to do so? is that what you're saying?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Absolutely.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they can set it at any amount they choose.
