with him. There was and has been a professor out at the University of California at Berkeley that's been working on this for over 40 years. I started at the University of Nebraska in 1954. And I can tell you that the University of Nebraska football players at that time did get a stipend. It was 15 or 20 bucks a month, or something like that, as I recall. But they did get the stipend. And I think that went for everybody that was out for football, not just those that were on scholarship. There's been many good things that the NCAA has done over the years. The Academic All-Americans over here at UNL are, I think, one of the great testaments to our local university. I...we are almost double the second-place team in Academic All-Americans. And the reason I bring this up is that I think one of the great failings of the NCAA is that they fail to get schools to give their players an education. Basketball shows this far more than football. There are people going on a regular basis to the NCAA basketball tournament that never graduate a player from their team. There are schools in the Big 12 conference that don't do a very good job. Look at what happened...look at the record at the end of the year when they publish what it is for the Big 12. Nebraska is one of the outstanding examples of seeing to it that the players do get an education. Not everybody does that. I think this is one of the great failings of the NCAA. A couple of things. You'll notice not many Nebraska football players said, yeah, yeah, we got to have that. University has done many good things over the years. Do you ever realize why Nebraska goes to their bowl games over Christmas? It's because they close the dorms, and if the university didn't take these kids with them to Christmas, they'd literally be left out on the street, and some of these players don't have any money, and that's where they would end up, that's where their Christmases would be. How about a few of the things that the NCAA has done in recent years? I might be a little bit off on these, because I just remembered them off the top of my head. But I remember that we couldn't take a bus to the funeral of a fellow player a few years ago. A Creighton University golf team did the dastardly deed of not having enough players show up for a golf match, or golf tournament.
