universities and dictates to them, the NCAA will realize it has to make some changes. When they were restricting television coverage and saying that any area where a live game was being played a televised college game could not occur, they quickly made an exception for Washington, DC, because they said, those politicians can pass a law that will knock out everything the NCAA is doing. So they made an exception there. And they made exceptions in other areas where they were facing political ramifications. So what my amendment is designed to do is to put the Legislature in a position to enact a bill that is not going to in any way jeopardize the university. So I hope you will adopt this amendment. What it does is to strike the word "three". That word "three" is used in this way: the bill does not take effect until at least three other Big 12 legislatures act. This would raise that number from three to four. Then, instead of requiring a total of four Big 12 legislatures, it would require five. So I hope you will agree to this amendment. Then Senator Beutler has one which I think will raise some of the types of issues that Senator Johnson had talked about earlier. And because our numbers are thin, Mr. President,...
